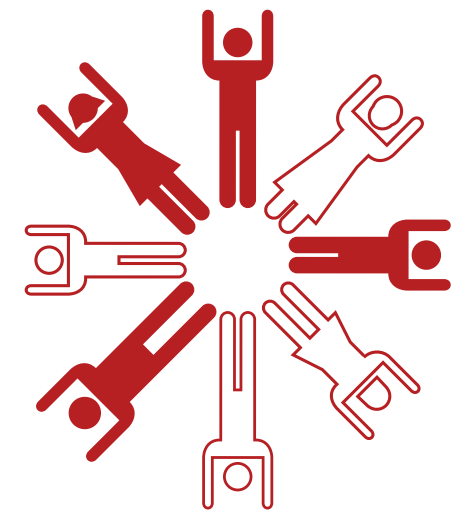
Funding is provided for governance roles and to facilitate broader civil society and community engagement
